# **Ongoing Surveys and Consultations**

- SCIP Database Survey:
  - The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA)asks for feedback and input about the SCIP database.

- Call for evidence on the certification of carbon removals:
  - The Commission opened for feedback a <u>call for</u> <u>evidence</u> on the certification of carbon removals according to the Communication on Sustainable Carbon Cycles.

## • FEAD feedback:

- 15<sup>th</sup> of March: FEAD provided a <u>reply</u> to the public consultation questionnaire on a "Policy framework on biobased, biodegradable, and compostable plastics" and also <u>feedback</u>.
- 14<sup>th</sup> of March: FEAD provided <u>feedback</u> to the call for evidence for the revision of the RoHS (Restriction of hazardous substances in electronics) Directive.

#### **Life of EU institutions**

#### • ETS & CBAM:

 The Council of the EU published on 15 March two proposals for regulations to detail the practical arrangements for the payment of resources from the carbon market (ETS) and the border carbon mechanism (CBAM).

### • Regulation on Construction Products:

- The European Commission is due to present the Regulation on Construction Products 30<sup>th</sup> of March.
- New regulatory framework for batteries:
  - The Council adopted its <u>position</u> (General Approach) on the proposal on batteries and waste batteries.
  - The Minister hopes to start the trilogues with the Parliament asap. Their trying to bring the reform to a successful conclusion under the French Presidency, by 30 June.
